Chimera Command Group (CCG) is the strategic umbrella company founded by Tyrone "Tyr" Jackson, serving as the operational and consulting nexus behind House of SoveReign and its affiliated ventures. CCG focuses on creative strategy, business development, and transmedia systems design—building sustainable infrastructures that merge storytelling, technology, and entrepreneurship. Its mission is to empower creators and brands to scale their ideas from vision to fully realized worlds.

House of SoveReign (HoS) is the flagship division under CCG, a transmedia publishing and entertainment house dedicated to crafting original worlds across comics, novels, music, and film. HoS redefines escapism through immersive storytelling—bridging imagination and industry to create experiences that inspire, challenge, and endure. Every project under HoS carries a singular message: Escape Reality. Enter The SoVerse.

What inspired you to create this or Join?

I've been a creator my entire life—it's the one constant that's followed me through every season, from the military to tech to storytelling. Creating wasn't a choice; it was instinct. What began as A. Reign Media Group evolved, piece by piece, into Chimera Command Group and eventually SoveReign Comics evolved into House of SoveReign—each transformation carrying a fragment of who I am: discipline from service, curiosity from tech, and imagination that refuses to stay still. A Chimera.

I didn't build this empire for fame or validation. I built it because creation is the language my soul speaks. I wanted to give others a place to escape, to imagine, to feel again. At its core, that's all I ever wanted—to create, and keep creating.

What was the biggest challenge you faced while doing this, and how did you overcome it?

The greatest challenge I've faced—then and now—is noise. In a world where the loudest often drown out the truest, the signal of authentic storytelling was nearly lost. Everyone was chasing attention, not meaning. The noise grew so thick it became visible—an echo chamber disguised as entertainment.

I overcame it by turning toward the quiet ones—the dreamers, the visionaries, the ones who still believe in wonder. I gathered them, one by one, and built a home for them inside House of SoveReign. A place where story still matters. A compound for creators and believers who refuse to be silenced by the static.

What first motivated you to get involved?

"Free Myth" and "Story-First" are more than mantras — they're philosophies. Free Myth means freedom to tell your story your way — unforced, unfiltered, unshackled by expectation. It's about representation through truth, not trend. And Story-First? That's the heart of creation itself. Long before brands, beliefs, or bias — there was story. Even sacred texts began as tales meant to move souls.

That's what drives me: honoring the art of storytelling as the creative god God designed me to be — shaping worlds with purpose, not permission.

Who or what has influenced your journey the most?

I've been shaped by the great architects of imagination—Stan Lee, Dwayne McDuffie, Todd McFarlane, Stephen King, Clive Barker, Wes Craven, Mary Shelley, Octavia Butler, and more. Their worlds taught me that creativity isn't about reinventing the wheel it's about upgrading it, refining it, and driving it across every terrain of myth, horror, and science fiction. The creative world is stacked, and I'm honored to build upon the roads they paved..

How do you stay motivated when the work becomes overwhelming?

My motivation comes from my family, my friends, and the Chimeras in the Kingdom. I'll go toe to toe with anyone when it comes to diehard fans. Their energy fuels me. Even on the heavy days, the will to create keeps me standing. The idea that I get to wake up, build worlds, and breathe life into imagination again? That's everything.

How has giving back changed you personally?

I've always wanted to give—I just never imagined it would be through story. Sharing worlds with people searching for meaning feels like giving breath to something bigger than myself. It makes me feel connected, part of something lasting. These stories will outlive me... and that's beautiful to think about.





Can you share a story of a moment that reminded you why this work matters?

There isn't just one moment—there are many, and together they tell the same story. Every time someone says I inspired them to start creating whether it's comics, art, prose, or screenwriting—it hits me deep. It always seems to happen right when I'm exhausted or doubting myself, as if the universe is reminding me, "See? What you do matters."

What misconceptions do people often have about what you do?

The biggest misconception? People think they already know the story. They look at the creator and assume they've decoded the work, judging the book by the cover and stopping there. My stories aren't surface-level; they're layered. The real message lives beneath, waiting for the reader who's willing to dig past what's loud to find what's true.

What advice would you give to someone who wants to get involved but doesn't know where to start?

Start. That's it. Don't let "not knowing where to start" become the reason you never do. Every story, every path, every spark begins somewhere. In my world—the SoVerse—each tale is a breach point, a doorway. There's no wrong entry, only missed ones if you wait too long. Just don't jump too far ahead —these stories connect, and if you skip the beginning, you'll miss the heart that makes it all matter.

It's a toss-up between putting the outfit together for the character or bringing the character to life by mimicking their behavior to a certain degree.


Do you ever get creator's block? If so, how do you push through it?

Hey everyone...I'm a 34-year-old gamer/streamer/content creator from The Bahamas. I started making gaming content for TikTok/Instagram during the 2020 pandemic and jumped into the streaming scene about a year ago on TikTok, but more recently on Twitch.

What first got you into gaming, and what was the very first game you ever played?

I've been a gamer for as long as I can remember but what really got me started was my older cousins who used to let me play their Super Nintendo. Super Mario world was probably the first game I ever played as well as first game I beat.

Do you prefer single-player story-driven games or multiplayer/competitive titles?

To be honest I am a fan of both. In the past I was more into single player games with really good stories but lately I find myself hooked on multiplayer games like marvel rivals.

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I've had the pleasure of playing a few hours of Pokémon Legends: Za, and I can say that I am enjoying the newest addition to the Pokémon Legends franchise. It's very fun gameplay-wise, the overhaul to the battle system took some getting used to as it seems less tactical, but it grew on me. Unlike Legends Arceus, which focused on catching, this entry focuses heavily on battles.

The battles mainly take place at night in battle zones, and the rank-up system in the game was similar to the Pokémon Journeys anime, which I thought was a cool touch. Another perk they brought back from the previous legends game was the noise shiny Pokémon make when they appear, which is perfect for a shiny hunter like me.

The setting for the game is based in one city, which isn't ideal.
The wild zones seem small for this game, but there are a lot of
side quests that open up as you progress through the story.
Keeps you busy and gives you a reason to explore and find
more Pokémon.

I will say I was slightly disappointed with the new mega Pokémon as they are 50/50 design-wise. But I am happy that the mega evolution mechanic is back in the games.


